POLICY FOR GREENHOUSES/POLYTUNNELS/SHEDS/BONFIRES ON ALLOTMENTS

Bonfires

No other material except Allotment Garden Rubbish can be burnt. Bonfires must be in a contained site and attended at all times whilst burning.

Bonfires may not be lit in very windy conditions.

No nuisance to be caused to neighbours by the lighting of a bonfire. Any complaints received shall be initially referred to the Clerk (or such other Officer as may from time to time be designated).

Sheds

Tenants must apply in writing for permission to erect a shed which will not normally exceed 8 x 6 feet in size.

The shed must be kept in good, clean and safe condition preferably with guttering and a water butt.

Upon giving up a plot the tenant may make arrangements for the shed to be taken on by the incoming tenant – if this is the case then the Clerk must be advised in writing. If the shed is not required by the incoming tenant then the outgoing tenant must remove the shed. Failure to do so will result in the Parish Council removing the shed and charging the cost to the outgoing tenant – see condition 2 p of your terms and conditions.

Greenhouses/Polytunnels

Tenants must apply in writing for permission to erect a greenhouse or polytunnel which will not normally exceed 8 x 6 feet in size. Plastic sheeting, plastic or toughened glass must be used to glaze the greenhouse.

Upon giving up a plot the tenant may make arrangements for the greenhouse or polytunnel to be taken on by the incoming tenant – if this is the case then the Clerk must be advised in writing. If the greenhouse or polytunnel is not required by the incoming tenant then the outgoing tenant must remove the greenhouse or polytunnel. Failure to do so will result in the Parish Council removing the greenhouse or polytunnel and charging the cost to the outgoing tenant – see condition 2 (p) of your terms and conditions.
